MICHAEL J AUSTIN

Michael Austin was born in 1959. Largely a self-taught artist, Austin has had no formal art training. Austin began his artistic career as a highly successful comic book illustrator and was the "Features Artist" for the Sunday Times national newspaper.

Austin's desire to fulfill his ambition to become a figurative artist led him to his first one-man show in London at the Jonathan Cooper Gallery in October 1996. The enormous success of the show led to a one-man show of his paintings at Art '97. Austin's paintings were the talk of the exhibition and his success grew. Comments such as "... paintings by Michael J. Austin, a technically brilliant artist who uses the human form for inspiration" were sited in the reviews.

HANNEKE BENADE

Hanneke's award-winning soft pastels are quiet and pensive figurative works, depicted with exquisitely delicate formal skill. Characteristically focusing on women shown in calm, contemplative poses, her figures are bathed in a tranquil light creating a timeless, Baroque-like stillness. They are private scenes with an ethereal mood, inviting the viewer to quietly admire their world of peaceful mediation.

Hanneke's paintings have been exhibited around South Africa for over 10 years in a number of public exhibitions and collections and she receives regular private commissions. Alongside her painting Hanneke has lectured at the University of Pretoria and curated a group exhibition of eighty artists 'Squared' Café Palette Pretoria Art Museum following a three month stint at the Cite Internationale des Arts, Paris December 1999 – 2000.


SPECIFIC FEEDBACK on Untitled II

Where the inspiration for that work comes from is through a succession of drawings that I have been making for some years now.

As child I was raised with the knowledge that I had an older brother in who died before I was born. Throughout my child hood he was often mentioned as a part of our family life. Having three sisters I longed for a brother as a child.

It was during a study visit to India in 1997 that I first started to draw him. Having no visual reference to how he might look I had the freedom to be as inventive as I liked and his first manifestations were quite abstract, and influenced by some of the figurative work that I was studying in India. However he has gradually become more real and lives in a strange world influenced by my own experiences and thoughts. He has taken on a family likeness and is currently around his mid fifties. From being a solitary figure he is increasingly surrounded by other characters and I am often surprised to find people I know unconsciously appearing in these drawings.

The Three men in the boat come from two separate incidents one being a disastrous tea party and the other being a cruise on a very similar small steam boat in Table Bay The original drawing for the work had elements that were eliminated from the painting.

SASHA HARTSLIEF

Sasha Hartslief was born and raised in Gauteng. At the age of seventeen, she came to Cape Town to study English and Philosophy at UCT. Hartslief had always been passionate about drawing, but the desire to become an artist only crystallised into a decision in 1995, when she enrolled at Cape College under the tutelage of Elizabeth Gunter.

Elizabeth Gunter specialised in classical drawing and introduced Hartslief to the textbook The Natural Way to Draw by Kimon Nicolaides, a Greek art teacher and master of drawing, who devoted his life to documenting exercises that facilitate the shift in perception required to accurately represent an objective form.

During her studies Hartslief devoted as much as five hours a day to his exercises. She would draw at every possible opportunity, whether in shopping malls or Government Avenue, and pasted a quotation from Nicolaides above her easel to remind herself:

"If I were asked what one thing more than any other would teach a student how to draw, I should answer, Drawing -incessantly, furiously, painstakingly drawing."

Consequently Hartslief has a well-earned a reputation as a highly skilful draftsman. Her subjects are often viewed from a philosophical, deeply personal perspective, resulting in striking works that are emotionally charged, pensive in mood and considered in composition.

Since 1999, Hartslief has exhibited regularly at The Everard Read Gallery, Cape Town including two solo exhibitions in May 2001 and in May 2004. She continues to attract a broad collector base from around the world and is clearly one of South Africa's most exciting young talents.

ISAAC KHAN

BORN 1950, in Kaunas (Lithuania).

His father was a painter. In 1964 he moved with his mother and sister to Israel, where he attended the "D. Israel Goldstein" Art Institute and the "Bezalel" Art Academy, in Jerusalem.

In 1973 he moved to Uruguay where he continued his studies at the University of Plastic Arts in Montevideo. With other sculptors he worked on the huge creation of the "Uruguay national shield" and the "Elnacimiento de nuestra nacion", and a diorama of the declaration of independence "Piedra Alta de Florida", which are all displayed in the Law Building. These works earned him a letter of thanks from President Esteban R. Cristi.

In 1975, at 25 years of age, he presented his first one-man exhibition in the Exhibition Hall of Montevideo with the sponsorship of the Uruguay-Israel Cultural Institute.

His first work was purchased by the widow of the President of Uruguay, Matilde Ibanez de Battle Berros.

He also worked with many other artists, including names like Luis Gianmarchi and Octavio Podesta, and in particular, Carlos Montañez, his painting master and dean of the University, but also a disciple and assistant of Sicheiros.

In 1976 he returned to Israel, where he opened a studio and continued working.

In 1978 he received a sculpture prize from the Latin American Organisation in Israel (O.L.E.I.).

In 1983 his sculpture "Pas de deux" was purchased by the Hasidof family and donated to the Abima National Theatre of Tel Aviv.

In 1984 he began working in Italy with the Bonvicini Fonderia Artistica, and still works with them today. In the same year he took part for the first time in the Art Expo in New York and began working with principal American galleries.

In 1991 he moved to Italy. For a few years he taught painting and sculpture at the Open University. His sculptures were shown in prestigious galleries in principal European capitals like Paris, Geneva and Brussels.

He opened a showroom in the centre of Verona where a permanent exhibition shows his sculptures, paintings and drawings. Among his collectors are ambassadors, consuls, and figures from the show business and fashion worlds.

His works can be found in public and private collections in the USA, South America, Israel, Europe, Japan and Korea.

'SCULPTING MUSIC' - Uberto Tommasi, on Isaac Khan

The pleasure of violating the rational limits of reality is almost always to be found in art. But the difference lies in the forms through which this pleasure becomes a force able to transform the dominant rationality. An example of this is to be found in the works of the Lithuanian sculptor Isaac Kahn; although they challenge classical realism, they appear to be the incarnation of that concept of revival, which in the 1970's began to set itself against the ultramodern, exaggerated avant-garde. A revival of memory, of the cultural past, attempting to restore to artistic creation its lost interiority.

This interiority was not conceived as a naïve recourse to a repository for shapes, ideas, sensations but rather as a constantly dynamics, uncertain and renewed relationship. In plain terms, a return to the figure and to the craft itself, which characterises each of Isaac's works.

The ensemble of Kahn's works is so harmonious that running the eye over them becomes like running the fingers over the keys of a piano. Isaac's creations can be enjoyed in which it is impossible to find an angle from which the balance of the figure is lost. Looking at and touching a statue is like a musical experience, a melody developing from the outline of a figure; to understanding it fully we must draw closer to the sculptures with the lustful gaze of a voyeur and the sensitive hand of a lover slipping over the loved one's skin.

To remain on the subject of talent, craftsmanship and rapidity, another work – entitled ''Acrobat'' – in bronze with green patina, is perfectly measured to express the non-accidental nature of creation, revealing indeed the geometrical-mathematical process which has allowed the creator to give the sculpture harmony laden with symbolic meaning.

Obviously it is difficult to represent a human being in bronze, and it is practically impossible to sculpt music, yet this is what Isaac has managed to do.



Anton Momberg has emerged as arguably South Africa's finest realist in sculpture, focusing mainly on the female nude. His finely crafted work cast in marble dust and resin has an unearthly, unsettling quality that somehow makes a monolith of the contemporary female form, as distinct from the "Venus" of antiquity.

Momberg has also turned his hand to other subjects he admires, notably an immaculate full length sculptural portrait of Mahatma Gandhi, an edition of which can be viewed at the National Gallery and at the King George VI gallery in Port Elizabeth.

The meticulous nature of Momberg's work and the fact that he casts them himself means that he has at best produced one new sculpture a year over the last ten years a remarkable and unique commitment to quality in an age of mass production.


She was also part of exhibitions by The Director's Collection, The National Exhibition for the Year of the Black Aged and Artists Under the Sun.

This artist continues to live and work in the Eastern Cape, where he thrives on the austerity and solitude of the region. It seems that this environment is conducive to the enigmatic silence so characteristic of his finest work. None of the currently favored classifications apply to his work, rather he belongs with those individual realists who have, throughout the modern era, defied categorization.

What he pursues is the universality, timelessness and harmony to be found in all great art from whatever period or place. It is a measure of his conviction of the continuity of great art that he remains unmoved by revolutions, fashions or attitudes. Regular trips to Europe reinforce his cultural connections, which are to the Mediterranean by inclination and to the Netherlands by training.

His work covers an unusually wide range of content and he has worked in a variety of media in both painting and sculpture. The vehicle for this content is also in a perpetual state of flux, so that ever new perceptions are evinced, be it of the portrait, of the nude, of the landscape, of the animal painting. For this artist the quest for refinement and distillation never ceases.

CARYN SCRIMGEOUR

Caryn Scrimgeour was born in Johannesburg in 1970 and has lived in Cape Town since 1972. In 1991 she graduated from the University of Stellenbosch with a B.A in Fine Art.

Since graduating she has worked extensively as a mural and trompe l'oeil painter as well as specializing in restoration of frames and giltwork. She has recently started painting full time again and works mainly in oils on canvas. She currently lives in Durbanville with her five year old daughter, Emily whose influence is evident in the subject matter of several paintings, especially "Snail", which was selected for the 2001 Vuleka awards exhibition.

Caryn's subject matter is chosen from commonplace objects that surround her; particularly objects that are fragile and easily destructible. Delicate chinaware, glassware and insects are often incorporated into her paintings and combined with richly patterned fabrics. These objects and subject matters are in turn given a deeply personal significance and used as 'a personal reflection of occurrences and events which have had a significant impact in my life... (They) trace a journey which could easily be applied to any woman living anywhere in the world independent of the demographics or political aspects of a situation.'

Her works are filled with symbolism and the place settings in these works consequently, 'become representative of major events which impacted on my life over the past ten years but which are also events that most women will experience in the course of their lives, in one form or another.'

For example, in 'Cape Plate' and 'Three Course Meal' Caryn writes, 'The constantly changing positions of the knives and forks are indicative of the inconsistency and fluctuation of what we see as sacred or fundamental to our core beliefs.' In a similar style the messages conveyed via her work 'Waiting' are more blatant, 'an empty place setting symbolising a loss of self, emptiness and missed opportunities.'

Alongside these deeply personal works Caryn continues her trompe l'oeil background with her still life painting. 'Diamond,' named simply after the type of the china, is a case in point. Here her precise technique and draftsmanship can be celebrated and admired in a more visual, rather than cerebral, light.



SHANY VAN DEN BERG

Shany was born in Riversdale in the Western Cape in 1958. After studying ceramics part-time from 1985, she studied life drawing and painting at Ruth Prowse School of Art from 1990 to 1992. Since then she started developing her own technique in oil painting and produced work exhibited at a variety of group exhibitions.

An art tour to Europe during 1998 greatly inspired her first successful solo in April 1999. Her work included oil paintngs as well as bronze sculptures, which consisted of figures growing from oryxhorns and cement bases. In February 2000 she participated with eleven other artists in an exhibition entitled "A Celebration of Art and Technology" in aid of the Nelson Mandela's Children's Fund sponsored by Hewlett Packard.


The ethereal, sensitive oil paintings by Shany van den Berg capture a mood reminiscent of contemporary mannerism and romanticism with a strong focus on technique. 



PIETER VAN DER WESTHUIZEN



Pieter van der Westhuizen was born in Pretoria, South Africa, in 1931. He studied Art at Unisa under Sakkie Eloff, Leo Theron, Robert Hodgins and others. In 1960 he worked under Alfred Krentz and in 1971 under Erik Laubscher. During 1979-80 he attended the Nationale Hoger Institute voor Schone Kunst at the Royal Academy for Fine Arts in Belgium. In 1982 and 1985 he continued his studies at the Stedelijke Akademie in Ghent and the Ryks Centrum voor Grafiek in Kasterlee, Belgium. During 1983 and 1985 he studied wood-block printing in Japan. His work comprises mainly landscapes, portraits, still life, figures and abstract pictures and he works in pastel, oil, watercolour, ink, pencil, charcoal and in various graphic media.

Pieter van der Westhuizen has had many one-man and group exhibitions and in 1988 and 1989 exhibited with Marc Chagall, Yaacov Agam, Ben Avram, inter alia, in Madrid, Spain. His recent exhibitions on the occasion of his 65th birthday were the biggest and most successful ever held in South Africa. He is widely regarded as the most popular artist in South Africa today. Pieter van der Westhuizen's works are today found in private and state collections in South Africa, Britain, France, Belgium, The Netherlands, America, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Germany, Sweden, Denmark, Switzerland, Italy, China, Japan and Israel. An exhibition of his work is planned for London in June 2000.

Born, as he puts it, "between the great drought, the depression and the Second World War", Van der Westhuizen discovered at a very young age that "the world I found myself in was not a comfortable one... At around the age of four I decided that this life was not for me. I began creating another world for myself - in pictures."



DERRIC VAN RENSBURG

Derric van Rensburg, internationally known for his superb impressionist paintings, is rated as one of South Africa's top artists. Born in 1952 in

Cape Town, Derric spent his early years painting and drawing on a family owned farm in the South-Western Cape.

He later studied Graphic Art in Cape Town, and worked for design and production companies linked to the art and advertising industry.

From 1990 until 1996, he and his family lived in the tranquil village of Greyton in the Overberg, not far from Cape Town. Living in the Overberg, which is mainly a farming district has had a great impact on him and the incredible beauty of the surrounding area is evident in his work. He works almost exclusively in acrylics with a highly decorative approach, reflecting a bold and impressionistic style. Bright primary colours such as blues, oranges, reds and greens interspersed with shapes and spaces featuring prominently, creating a portrayal that is colourful and alive, reminiscent of a true African image.

The magazine "International Artist " has featured Derric in an article where they describe his work as " rich, with almost juicy colour, providing so much entertainment and food for the imagination."

He has exhibited in South Africa and also in Portugal, England, Italy and Australia. Most of the artist's commissions are placed by multinational corporate clients. Some of these include: First National Bank (Barclays Bank), South African Airways, Transnet, Liberty Life, Price Waterhouse, MIB, Sabax, Denmar Clinic, Ernst and Young, Reebok, BP and Mobil as well as the Table Bay Hotel at the Waterfront in Cape Town and the Golden Tulip Lord Charles Hotel in Somerset West.

After studying at the Brooks Institute of Photography in California, USA, Petter was hired as an assistant for Richard Avedon in New York before returning to his hometown of Stavanger, Norway. Only 21, he started his own studio and soon established himself as one of Norway's most successful photographers.
